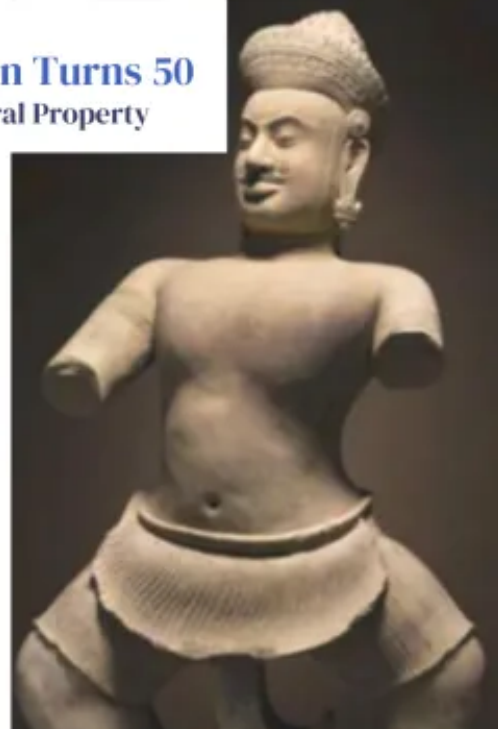

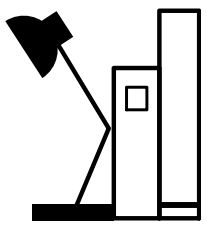

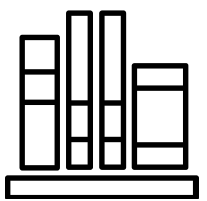


In 2020-2021, the Center for Art Law received and reviewed over 100 applications from undergraduate, graduate and law school students sharing a passion for art, law, and social justice.

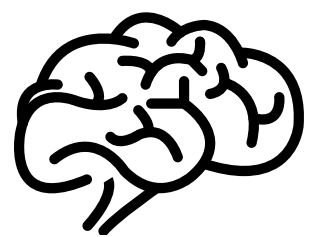
TRAINING
